This term, our key texts are 'Stickman', 'Zog' and 'Superworm' by Julia Donaldson and Axel Scheffler as part of Book Week, and 'Katie in London,' by James Mayhew for our Bright Lights, Big City topic. Using our texts as a starting point, we will be comparing stories by Julia Donaldson and other authors, writing letters and post cards, as well as non-fiction recounts.



Teaching Phonics - Little Wandle Letters and Sounds

Jattle (Quadle LETTERS AND SOUNDS REVISED Here at Rye, our new phonics programme is well under way.

Although your child will be taught to read at school, you can have a huge impact on their reading journey by continuing their practice at home. As we begin the programme, you will notice a change in the types of reading books your child will bring home. There are two types of reading book:

An e-reading practice book.

This will be at the correct phonic stage for your child. They should be able to read this fluently and independently.

The e-reading book will be set ready for the week ahead on Mondays.

Your child may not be able to read this on their own. This book is for you both to read and enjoy together.

How You Can Help

There is a school expectation that all KSI children should read daily at home. Talk to them about what they are reading, ask them questions about the story, characters and plot. Perhaps they can they predict what will happen next?

Look at information texts with your child and look at the clossary and contents page to find out where you could locate more information. Our focus this term is on punctuation and how we can use it in our writing.

We are also beginning to use joined handwriting. Please encourage your child to form their letters correctly when they are writing at home. Further information about this will be sent home soon, but if you are unsure about this, please come and ask us.

This will be followed by place value and statisitics.

How You Can Help

Support your child's learning by counting foreward and back in 1s, 2, 5s and tens. It is important for the children to be able to count fluently up to and across 100.

Please bely your child learn their times-tables by learning the multiples of 2, 5 and 10 (year 1) and 2, 5, 10 and 3 (year 2).

The first step is to learn to count on, and in year 2 they should try to recite their tables fluently.

Forest School

All classes will take part in Forest School over the course of the year. Children will need to bring in a long-sleeved t. shirt and trousers, water-proofs and wellington boots. As always, these items should be named to avoid getting them lost

Home learning

In Key Stage 1, homework is set weekly. Reading Eggs and Maths Seeds tasks are set after school on a Friday and should be completed by the following Friday. You will have been sent the login details in your child's reading record book, but please ask their class teacher if you need them again! Any children who have been unable to complete their online homework tasks will have them reset, as well as the new homework.

Spellings are also set on Fridays. They are posted on the class webpages, as well as on Class Dojo. The children write their spellings in a test the following Friday.

Water Bottles and macks

A hydrated brain is essential to learning! Please ensure that your child brings in a named water bottle. All key-stage 1 children are offered a healthy snack each day. They can also bring in their own <u>healthy snack</u> to have in snack time. It is really helpful if water bottles and fruit-tubs are named so they can be returned if they get lost.

Due to severe nut-allergies, we are a nut-free school.

Please ensure all snacks and lunch box items are nut-free, including biscuits such as cereal bars. We are extremely appreciative of your support in this.






