


Rationing - part 1

Food was in short supply during the war. Food had to be shared out fairly throughout the nation so many people grew fruit and vegetables in their gardens, many also had chickens. If they didn't have a garden, many people had an allotment so they could grow extra food for their hungry tummies!

Rationing - part 2

Many recipes were designed to make the most of the food that was available and people were encouraged to use everything and not waste a single thing.

How about trying these tasty recipes?

Carrot Biscuits

Ingredients:

1 tablespoon margarine
2 tablespoons sugar + a little extra
A few drops vanilla flavouring
4 tablespoons grated raw carrot
6 tablespoons Self Raising flour (or plain flour + a half teaspoon of baking powder).

Method:

- Cream the fat and sugar until light and fluffy.
- Beat in the flavouring and carrot.
- Fold in the flour.
- Form mixture into about 12 or 15 small balls.
- Place each ball on a baking tray and flatten.
- Sprinkle with sugar and bake in a brisk oven for 20 minutes.



Potato Short Bread

Ingredients:

3 ozs margarine
2 ozs rice flour
Pinch of salt
Little almond flavouring
4 ozs warm mashed potato
3 ozs flour
2 ozs sugar

Method:

- Cream fat and sugar
- Then add mashed potato, beat well, then rice flour, salt and flavouring.
- Take out spoon and with hands lightly press the flour (containing a little baking powder) into the mixture.
- Roll out and bake.

Patriotic Pudding

Ingredients

4 table-spoons Flour
4 table-spoons grated raw
Potato or Fine Oatmeal
1 table-spoon Fat
 $\frac{1}{2}$ table-spoon Jam, Treacle or
Milk and Water to mix Syrup
and 1 grated Carrot
 $\frac{1}{2}$ tea-spoon Bicarbonate of
Soda
Pinch of Salt
2 tea-spoons grated Orange
or Lemon Rind (if available)
Milk and Water to mix

Method:

- Rub the fat into the flour, add the rest of the dry ingredients and mix well.
- Add the jam and carrot, heated in four table-spoons of milk and mix to a soft mixture adding more milk or water if necessary.
- Turn into a well-greased bowl, cover and steam for 1 hour.

OR:

- Place jam and carrot in the bottom of a well-greased bowl make the mixture as above, mixing the dry ingredients with the milk only.

Steamed Chocolate

Duff

6 oz. Flour
 $\frac{3}{4}$ Teaspoon baking powder
2 $\frac{1}{2}$ Teaspoons cocoa
2 $\frac{1}{2}$ Teaspoons sugar
1 $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. Fat
1 $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. Grated raw potato
Milk and water

Method:

- Rub fat into flour and mix all ingredients together.
- Make into soft dough with the liquid.
- Steam in a small greased mould for about 30-40 minutes.
